### QCF Feedlots:

- are regular suppliers of finished cattle to USPB, and have experience in managing and marketing cattle to our value-based endpoint.
- are USPB members, and make those units available for customer use.
- actively promote U.S. Premium Beef to their customer base.
- encourage the use of individual animal electronic identification systems.
- consult veterinary expertise for selection and proper use of animal health products.
- consult the services of a nutritionist for information on feeding cattle for a value-based marketing system.
- manage stress on incoming feeder cattle to ensure optimum cattle feedlot and carcass performance.

USPB field staff conducts regular interviews at these ranches to answer questions and ensure production and management practices agree with USPB guidelines.
